EXPERIENTIAL EDUCATION

Youth will work closely with program staff, conservation professionals, and partner education programs on stewardship projects, inquiry-based experiential outdoor education, and professional development. In doing so, YCC members gain applied job skills and training that can help propel them into their future.

Daily activities can include: forest stand mapping, Traditional Ecological Knowledge of native plants, wildfire risk reduction, wetland and riparian zone recovery, invasive weed removal, and trail building/brushing.
